Dear Mr. Shapiro:

The Department of Defense, Freedom of Information Division, Office of Litigation Support is providing the final response to your June 10, 2017, Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request. That request was assigned case number 17-F-1102, now Litigation case number 17-L-1102 (civil action 1:17-cv-02592-KBJ). Our office tasked DOD components; Defense Human Resources Activity Office, Under Secretary of Defense, Acquisitions, Technology, and Logistics (AT&L), and the Defense Manpower Data Center (DMDC), which conducted a records search and a line-by- line review of responsive documents located. Enclosed, please find 365 pages responsive to your request. Portions of these pages have been redacted because they are exempt from release pursuant to the FOIA exemptions 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(6) and 10 U.S.C. § 130b (b)(3) as identified in the redacted areas.

The withholdings under Exemption (b)(6) apply to information, which if released, would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of the personal privacy of individuals. Finally, exemption (b)(3), 130(b) applies to personally identifiable information of personnel assigned in overseas, sensitive or routinely deployable positions. Please note, document number 58 contains a PDF of a four page spreadsheet, which will require you to zoom in on the document to read the entries, and may require legal size paper when printing.

Because the withheld information is a matter of litigation, your appeal rights are considered moot.
